The other book is "Quiet Strength: a memoir" by Tony Dungy. A testament to his faith, his life and spiritual purpose. The lives he touched and the legacy he left surpassed his role as one of the greatest football coaches in Indiana!



Back Porch Conversations Coming in June

We have a new back porch! Let's use it!

Pastor Mary will host Back Porch Conversations this summer on Wednesdays, 6:00 p.m. Topics will vary but we'll begin by reading and discussing a wonderful book entitled *Protest at Midnight* by Peter Storey. Storey is a Methodist minister and leader who lived through apartheid in South Africa and helped to dismantle the cruel system of government. *Protest at Midnight* is his memoir. **So mark your calendars for summer Wednesdays!**

At a recent event that honored Storey's work, Pastor Mary purchased a copy of the book which Storey signed for the church with this inscription:

To the Nashville United Methodist Church. Wishing you powerful witness for Jesus and his peace, love and justice, Peter Storey, 2022.

Juneteenth National Independence Day is June 19 with its observance as a federal holiday observed on Monday, June 20. Our Brown County Public Library will host an event with music and information about the history of the day on Monday, June 13. Watch for additional information.

What is Juneteenth?

On January 1st 1863, Abraham Lincoln declared the end of slavery with the Emancipation Proclamation. Two and half years later, and two months after the end of the Civil War, Union troops arrived in Galveston on June 19th 1865 to find that news of the proclamation had not yet reached Galveston and that people were still being held as slaves in Texas.

The leader of the Union Troops, General Gordon Granger then formally announced the emancipation from the balcony of the former Confederate Army headquarters.

The reason why the news about the emancipation took so long to reach Texas is subject to speculation. One theory is that the messenger who was originally sent with the news had been killed before he reached Texas. A more likely scenario is that the local slave owners simply held onto the information, ignoring the emancipation order.

Although the news of the emancipation reached towns at different times across the South, there was a collective decision to recognize 19th June as the date of the emancipation. The date of the proclamation itself (January 1st) wasn't considered as the people wanted to mark the date when the slave's lives were actually affected by the new freedom.

Celebrations have traditional included parades, storytelling, barbecue and baseball. Strawberry so-

da pop is the drink of choice and the building from which General Granger read the Proclamation is now a historic landmark.

All states have recognized Juneteenth as a day of celebration and a number of states had already made the holiday a state observance when President Joe Biden signed it into law last summer.
